One of the most delicious and special things about serving as the Rabbi of MLRT for these many years is the blessing of watching our and your children grow up, and having the opportunity to share with you and your family and friends so many of life's seminal moments. Confirmation is one of those transcendent moments for me. I hope you will join us for Confirmation on Friday evening, May 31 at 8:00 PM.

Rabbi Straus

Confirmation on a Friday night, and not on Shavuot, when we ordinarily hold our Confirmation Service. This year, high school final exams fall in the middle of Shavuot. With all the anxiety and stress so many of our students already feel, we did not want to add to the pressure.

I have literally known our confirmands their entire lives. For some of them, I was blessed to share in their brit or naming. I remember for some their opening days of attending our Early Childhood Education Program—not knowing who was more anxious or excited—the parents or our students. I have memories of their being Shabbat King and Queen, marching with the Torah; of Consecration, and the beginning of Religious School; and most of all, the blessing of standing with them in front of the Torah as they were called to the Bima as a Bar and Bat Mitzvah. With all I have been blessed to share the joys of life, and with some, we have journeyed through the valley of shadows that comes to each and every life.

But for me, what makes Confirmation so special is to experience the growth and maturity, especially intellectually and spiritually, that happens right before our eyes, as they turn from 13 year olds to young adults. Reading Jewish texts with them each week, discussing with them, both hopefully learning with them and from them as we talk about the major political, moral and social issues confronting our times and how our tradition can help shape our understanding of those issues is really exciting. So often when I return home after class on Tuesday night, and Lynne asks, "how did it go?" I can barely contain my excitement over the depth of the conversation and learning we've just shared.

Our tradition teaches that children are our future. Our Confirmation students are our future. Having had the honor with Rabbi Newburge, Cantor Rudnick and Ross M. Levy of teaching them each week—we are in for a bright, hopeful and exciting future.

### President's Message: Leadership Transition

Earlier this month, I had the bittersweet honor to announce to the congregation that MLRT's Executive Director, Melissa Johnson, was named Chief Planning & Strategy Officer for the Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia. As a result, MJ will be leaving her role at MLRT effective June 2, 2019.

We have been privileged to have MJ's dedicated leadership of our congregation over the past ten years. We very much appreciate all of the time, energy and sacrifice she has given to her outstanding work on behalf of our community. MLRT has come a long way in ten years due in large part to her conscientious work and heartfelt commitment to our congregation. We thank MJ for her years of accomplished and devoted service.

The famous railroad executive Alfred Edward Perlman said "After you've done a thing the same way for two years, look it over carefully. After five years, look at it with suspicion. And after ten years, throw it away and start all over." We are not going to throw everything away, but MJ's departure creates the opportunity for us to review MLRT's operations and to determine what can be improved or restructured.

We want to take an appropriate amount of time to conduct this review, to implement desired changes, and to decide on the requirements for the next permanent executive director for MLRT. Once this work has been completed, we will undertake a comprehensive search to find the best person to fill this very important position. While we have already started this work, I anticipate that it will take at least four to six months to complete. In the interim, it is imperative that leadership is in place to oversee smooth operations and an effective transition.

I am therefore pleased to announce that we have hired Esther Herst as our Interim Executive Director. Esther will start with us on May 24, 2019. Esther is an experienced Executive Director and will provide stability and fresh insights as we move through this transition.

After graduating college, Esther was a lobbyist and ultimately became the National Director for the National Committee Against Repressive Legislation. After getting married, she moved to Seattle and became the Executive Director for the state of Washington for the National Abortion Rights Action League. She then transitioned to congregational life and was an executive director for two congregations. After a major health issue which required her to take time off to focus on her health, she was asked by a friend in New York to become their interim Executive Director. She did that role and decided that she really enjoyed it. Since then, during the past seven years, she has been the interim Executive Director at seven Reform congregations across the country. According to the President of the National Association of Temple Administration, Esther invented the role of interim Executive Director and is the benchmark against which all others are compared. I think we are very fortunate to have Esther join us.

Open communication is a hallmark of strong organizations especially in times of transition. Please do not hesitate to reach out to me or Rabbi Straus should you have any questions or concerns. I can be reached at president@mlrt.org.



### **Program**



Rabbi Abraham Skorka was born in Buenos Aires, Argentina, earned a PhD in Chemistry from the Universidad de Buenos Aires and earned his rabbinical degree from the Seminario Rabínico Latinoamericano. He was the Rector of the Seminario for 20 years and Rabbi of the Benei Tikva

Congregation for 42 years.

Known as the "Pope's Rabbi," he developed an intensive activity in the interfaith dialogue, especially with the current Pope Francis, with whom he wrote a book of dialogues and recorded 31 television programs at the time that Bergoglio was the Archbishop of Buenos Aires. He was an official member of the Vatican delegation in Pope Francis' visit to the Holy Land. He has received honorary doctorates from the Universidad Catolica Argentina, Jewish Theological Seminary, Sacred Heart University and was honored with the Jan Karsky Eagle Award in 2017.

Rabbi Skorka is currently a visiting University Professor in the Institute for Jewish-Catholic Relations at Saint Joseph's University.


