## BLESSINGS AT THE TORAH

The person called to the Torah recites:

Barchu et Adonai ham'yorach.

בַּרְכוּ אֶת־וְיָ הַמְבֹרָךְ.

Praise the Eternal, to whom our praise is due!

Congregation responds:

Baruch Adonai ham'vorach l'olam va-ed.

בָּרוּךְ יְיָ הַמְבֹּרָךְ לְעוֹלָם וָעִד.

Praised be the Eternal, to whom our praise is due, now and for ever!

The person repeats the response and continues:

Baruch Ata Adonai, Eloheinu melech ha-olam, asher bachar banu mikol ha-amim, v'natan lanu et torato. Baruch Ata Adonai, notein haTorah. בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ, אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר בָּחַר בָּנוּ מִכָּל־הָעַמִּים, וְנָתַן לָנוּ אֶת־תוֹרָתוֹ. בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ, נוֹתֵן הַתוֹרָה.

Blessed is the Eternal our God, Ruler of the universe, who has chosen us from all peoples by giving us the Torah. Blessed is the Eternal, Giver of the Torah.

After the portion is read, the person says:

Baruch Ata Adonai, Eloheinu melech ha-olam, asher natan lanu torat emet, v'cha-yei olam nata b'tocheinu. Baruch Ata Adonai, notein haTorah.

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ, אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר נָתַן לָנוּ תּוֹרַת אֱמֶת, וְחַיֵּי עוֹלָם נָטֵע בְּתוֹכֵנוּ. בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ, נוֹתֵן הַתּוֹרָה.

Blessed is the Eternal our God, Ruler of the universe, who has given us a Torah of truth, implanting within us eternal life. Blessed is the Eternal, Giver of the Torah.
