Dear Friends,

This year marks the 75th anniversary of the end of World War II. For us as Jews, this year also marks the 75th "anniversary" of the Shoah, or Holocaust, when 6 million of our brothers and sisters, including 1 million children were brutally and savagely murdered by the Nazis. Last month in Jerusalem, many of the world's leaders gathered at Yad Vashem to observe the UN's Holocaust Memorial Day. The Jewish community has its own day for remembering the Shoah, Yom Hashoah u'Gvurah, which we will observe on Monday, April 20. (The reasons for two separate days of commemoration is another sermon.)

We have been invited to join the Church of the Redeemer (Bryn Mawr) on Saturday evening March 21, when their choirs will perform a work entitled <u>Annelies</u>, by James Whitbourn. This composition is the first

adaptation of the Diary of Anne Frank in a large-scale choral work. The chamber version of this oratorio is scored for chorus, soprano solo, clarinet, violin, cello and piano. I think it is incredibly powerful and moving that the Church of the Redeemer should both be performing this work in memory of Anne Frank, and turn to us, MLRT, to be their partner in bringing this important work to our community. I hope you and your family and friends will join me at the Church of the Redeemer as our two communities share this experience together. I also hope this will be the beginning of more collaboration, learning, and partnering together as two leading communities of faith on the Main Line.

Critically acclaimed soprano Arianna Zukerman will be accompanied by the famed Lincoln Trio, all of whom are Grammy nominated musicians. Michael Diorio, the church's Music Director, will lead the choirs of Church of the Redeemer and conduct the performance on Saturday, March 21 at 7:30 pm at Church of the Redeemer, 230 Pennswood Road, Bryn Mawr. This incredible evening of music and partnership is \$25 for adults, \$15 for students, and free for children 12 and under.

Michael has written for his community: The Holocaust was a devastatingly haunting part of history linked not only to the Jewish community but all of humanity. By performing this particular work we hope to connect faith communities and foster a sense of ecumenical resolve and unity. This work stirs an awareness of that which has been endured in the hope that tolerance and understanding will rise from the ashes of hate.

The performance of this work is timely on multiple levels, particularly given our world's current events that seem to smolder with intolerance, as the brutal attacks on places of worship in the past few months have alarmingly shown. The words and music transcend the boundaries of religious difference, they speak beyond dogma, and form an expression of the divine.

The text is unadorned. The words are simple, originating in a young girl with a most unique optic of her place in the world: what it could be, and the reality of what it was for her. With her own words, set to song, we hope to bridge generations by the relevance of that narrative.

Please come out on March 21 and support this important initiative by our neighbors. When others reach out to us in love and care, we need to respond.

Get excited! Cantor Rudnick will be teaching a five-part class on Jewish Music on Wednesdays, starting April 22.

The first class will be an overview of Jewish music history and the remaining classes will explore the composers who inspire us and paved the path for the music we have today including Solomon Sulzer, Max Janowski, Debbie Friedman, and more. The Religious Education task force, a large group of passionate and dedicated members of our congregation, has been working to understand the religious educational needs of our children and investigating new alternative education models. The task force has recommended changes to transform our religious education programs to better serve our children. Finally, our Tikkun Olam Network supports many social action projects including programs to address food insecurity, illiteracy, women's shelters, aid to immigrants, and programs against gun violence. There will be an opportunity to learn more about all of these initiatives at the Annual Meeting.

It has been my pleasure and honor to work for the past year with an outstanding team of officers. They are Vice Presidents Dave Heppen, Rachel Lester, and David Rawdin, Treasurer Vic Haas, Financial Secretary Brett Cohen, and Recording Secretary Beth Allen. In addition to these officers, there are many other dedicated lay leaders of our congregation including members of the Board of Trustees, chairpersons and members of various committees, leaders and members of Brotherhood and Sisterhood, and volunteers for our many programs, projects, and events. ABOUT PURIM

Purim is a joyous holiday that affirms and celebrates Jewish survival and continuity throughout history. The main communal celebration involves a public reading—usually in the synagogue—of the Book of Esther, Megillat Esther, which tells the story of the holiday: under the rule of King Ahashverosh, Haman, the king's adviser, plots to exterminate all of the Jews of Persia. His plan is foiled by Queen Esther and her cousin Mordechai, who ultimately save the Jews of Persia from destruction. The reading of the Megillah typically is a rowdy affair, punctuated by booing and noise-making when Haman's name is read.

In the Book of Esther, we read that Purim is a time for "feasting and merrymaking," as well as for "sending gifts to one another and presents to the poor" (Esther 9:22). In addition to reading Megillat Esther, celebrants dress in costumes, have festive parties, perform "Purim-shpiels," silly theatrical adaptations of the story of the Megillah, send baskets of food (mishloach manot) to friends, and give gifts to the poor (matanot l'evyonim). reformjudaism.org/purim

The year seems to be flying by and we have been as busy as ever with Sisterhood events and projects. Your Shalach Manot package from friends/family at MLRT should be arriving any day now. It's a mitzvah to send Shalach Manot at Purim and we have kept this time-honored tradition alive at MLRT through the dedication and hard work of many people. We would not be able to provide this lovely service to our members without the invaluable help of Mark Komen, the MLRT staff and our volunteers, and without the generous donation from Just Born Quality Confections. Many thanks to all who participated and helped make it such a success!

Our Shalach Manot fundraiser brings together many of our members for packing and distributing over 650 bags. Proceeds of this important fundraiser (which last year exceeded \$ 15,000) are used for improvements to our Temple and charitable pursuits. In the past, we have purchased lobby furniture, cushions for the sanctuary benches, recording equipment for our music department, a gaga pit for Religious School, and

partial funding for the lighting of the stained glass panels in the sanctuary.

Teach Our Children: ECE

Where is this year going? It seems like so many of the things we looked forward to at the beginning of the year have already happened and those we are still looking forward to are so close at hand. We had a visit from Poly the Clown, and marveled at his magic. On Tu B'Shevat, many of our students planted parsley which can be harvested just in time for Passover. Picture Day indelibly captured this moment of their childhood in time. Ahead, March brings our big annual fundraiser, Mitzvah Madness, and as always our learners are growing physically, emotionally, and intellectually through play.

We had author Rosanne L. Kurstedt visit recently to share her newest children's book, <u>Karate Kid</u>. The kids learned what authors do, how books are illustrated, and how they plan. They even tried some karate moves from the story. They were super excited about seeing a real live author! Children are natural storytellers even before they develop the skills to write letters and words and they too have been writing their own stories, just like the authors they read every day.

One of the things I most love about going around to the classrooms is witnessing the relationships that have developed between children. There is an empathy and an awareness that is fostered daily, and which I am always so inspired to witness, even among our littlest learners.

This week, I listened in awe as a teacher facilitated a conversation around kindness when something went awry in the classroom. She gave each child a chance to speak while every other child listened with their ears and their eyes while passing around a "breathing ball." In turn, each child felt empowered and heard.

In another classroom, a crying child asked another child to acknowledge her tears and to help her. That child asked her why she was crying and hugged her. Other children spontaneously hugged her and her tears stopped. So simple, this idea of asking for help, giving help that is needed, noticing when another is not ok. This is the kind of empathy I wish I could bottle. It is the kind of empathy we often race around and overlook, and it is here and it is inspiring and it is mindful.

Bret Stephens became an op-ed columnist and associate editor for the New York Times in 2017. Before that, he spent 11 years as the author of "Global View," the foreign-affairs column of the Wall Street Journal, for which he was awarded the Pulitzer Prize for distinguished commentary in 2013. He also served eight years as the Journal's deputy editorial-page editor, responsible for the newspaper's global opinion section, as well as a member of the editorial board.

Mr. Stephens began his career at the Wall Street Journal in 1998 as an editor in New York, and later wrote editorials and articles for the newspaper from Brussels. In January 2002 he was named editor-in-chief of the Jerusalem Post, a position he assumed at age 28. At the Post, he was responsible for the newspaper's news, editorial, digital and international editions, and also wrote a weekly column. Mr. Stephens returned to the Journal in late 2004. He has reported stories from around the world, including Pakistan, Afghanistan, Iraq, Lebanon, Gaza, and interviewed dozens of world leaders. In June 2017 he became a regular political analyst for MSNBC.

In 2014 Penguin published his book <u>America in Retreat: The New Isolationism and the Coming Global Disorder</u>. Former Secretary of State George Shultz hailed the book as "wise counsel for a constructive, tough-minded, and sensible foreign policy."




