BUILDING THE BELOVED COMMUNITY: MLK WEEKEND AND DAY OF SERVICE AT MAIN LINE REFORM TEMPLE

Each January, our nation pauses to honor the life and legacy of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. A modern prophet in his own right, he taught us that the measure of a community is found in its willingness to show up for one another. Dr. King had a vision for what he called "the beloved community:" A system that was rooted in daily acts of compassion, justice, and shared responsibility. A system that persistently leads us to ask ourselves: "What are you doing for others?"

Once again Main Line Reform Temple will be partnering with our friends at Beth Am Israel and Zion Baptist Church to respond in real time to that question over an entire weekend. Together with our interfaith partners we will welcome Shabbat on Friday evening, gather together on Saturday morning for Torah study and services, join together at church on Sunday for a final unity service, and finally, on Monday January 19, our community will transform all of that inspiration into action through a powerful MLK Day of Service.


Our Day of Service will feature thirteen different actions involving nearly every subgroup of our congregation. From Religious School families to teens, from our early childhood community to our seniors, from our Tikkun Olam Network to Sisterhood, Brotherhood, to several committees and organizations, and our clergy team, we will join hands in

service. As we do so, we may even catch a glimpse of the beloved community we so aspire to build.

Every act of service on Monday, January 19, 2026 will be a seed planted for a more compassionate world. Preparing salads, organizing clothing, assembling toiletry kits, preparing snack bags, writing cards, cleaning up a cemetery, singing for seniors, and so much more; Each act moves us one step closer toward our goal.

And as we work side by side, perhaps we will begin to sense what our patriarch, Jacob, sensed in the wilderness when he suddenly awoke and declared, "Surely God is in this place, and I did not know it." When we devote ourselves in service to those who need us, God becomes visible in the love we share, and the hope we restore.

I invite you to take part in this transformative four-day journey whether this is your first time or you are a vested veteran of the experience. Pray with us. Learn with us. Stand with our interfaith partners. Then join us on Monday as we turn inspiration into action and bend the arc of the moral universe that much closer toward justice. Amen.

Remembering is very important to Jewish people. The lessons we have learned from our shared past require us to remain vigilant, to safeguard our security and continuity by never forgetting. But remembering is also an intrinsically positive act. When we tell the Passover story, we appreciate all the freedoms we have. When we say Yizkor four times each year, we honor our departed by committing to good deeds and acts of charity. Remembering can be communal as well as deeply personal. When we recite the Mourner's Kaddish, visit a grave-site, or name a child after someone no longer with us, we remember their life and legacy, how much they meant to us, and how they would want us to be continuing on in their absence. Our remembering elevates their memory.

One of the ways MLRT remembers those important to our congregants is by our Yahrzeit Wall in the Sanctuary. For many years we have offered congregants the opportunity to purchase perpetual remembrance plaques to be displayed annually during the yahrzeit of a loved one. For many people, seeing their relatives' names and knowing they will not be forgotten at MLRT is a source of comfort and support.

If you have been in our Sanctuary recently, you have probably noticed that our yahrzeit wall now consists of two interactive digital display screens. In addition to displaying weekly

yahrzeit "plaques," the digital screens give us the ability to add photos or text to a loved one's record, and to link family members, creating a searchable memorial archive that more fully preserves our past. Many thanks go to Ross M. Levy for his efforts to honor tradition while embracing technology and sustainability, and to Sisterhood for generously funding this project.

We are excited to create meaning and remembrance together. 

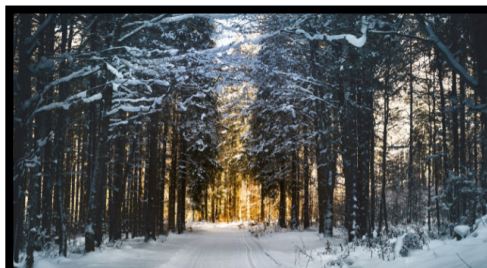
